# BARNSLEY

## Darfield All Saints (1)

A wonderful church with parts dating to the 10<sup>th</sup> century. Many interesting details of historical significance - medieval tombstones, medieval painted ceiling, 15<sup>th</sup> century tomb, Jacobean pews and numerous Saxon carvings including a dragon.

M1 J37. At crossroads turn right. Follow road to Stairfoot roundabout. Take 2<sup>nd</sup> exit A635 towards Doncaster. Follow into Darfield. Turn right onto Nanny Marr Road, and immediate left onto School Street. Bear left onto Church Street, church on left. (SATNAV: S73 9JX)



## Elsecar Holy Trinity (2)



### OPENING TIMES:

Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm

Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

### SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:

Children's colouring corner

Holy Trinity is a lovely church, consecrated in 1843. It is built in the gothic revival style that echoes back to early medieval times. The four stained glass chancel windows are a stunning example of William Morris & Co and were installed to commemorate parishoners killed during the First World War.

M1 J36. At 1<sup>st</sup> roundabout take the 1<sup>st</sup> exit onto A61, at the 2<sup>nd</sup> roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit onto A6135. Turn left onto Hoyland Road and right onto Fearnley Road. Turn left at Wath Road, church on left. (SATNAV: S74 8HS)



## Great Houghton St Michael & All Angels (3)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

**SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:** Children's quiz sheet  
Children's drawing materials

Explore one of three existing Cromwellian churches. Built in 1650 by Sir Edward Rhodes, who was a high ranking officer in Cromwell's army. St Michael's was built as a family chapel, with a 17<sup>th</sup> century door and Jacobean box pews and pulpit. It was visited by Cromwell within the first ten years of building. The extension built in 1959 contains pews by the famous Robert Thompson, with his trademark mouse clearly visible.

M1 J36. Follow A6195 Dearne Valley Parkway. At Cathill roundabout go straight. Next roundabout go straight into Great Houghton. Church Street on left.



## Grimethorpe St Luke (4)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 3pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 3pm

**SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:** Exhibition on the history of St Luke's Refreshments

Built in 1904 'by the miners, for the miners'. It is a spacious, imposing church which dominates the skyline of the village. Inside there are a number of unique features: the Lady Chapel has a new altar constructed from a reclaimed medieval stone from Lady Wood; new and modern stained glass windows; a new crucifix, based on the Cimabue in Florence and painted by a well renowned Romanian artist. There are a number of memorials outside the church.

M1 J37. Take A635 towards Barnsley, then A6195 Dearne Valley Parkway following signs for Grimethorpe. Turn right into village. Church on right. (SATNAV: S72 7JA)



## Hoylandswaine St John the Evangelist (5)

Information on the William Morris windows & mural

Discover this lovely village church, built in 1867. The church has a wonderful William Morris east window and much more to see.

M1 J37. Take A628 towards Penistone. Turn right onto Barnsley Road into Hoylandswaine. Turn right onto Haigh Lane and follow through village. Church on left. (SATNAV: S36 7JJ)



## Midhopstones St James (6)

Come and visit this beautiful hamlet, high in the Pennines north west of Sheffield. St James' is a tiny rugged church, surrounded by a picturesque graveyard. It is built of grey sandstone, with roof tiles of the same material. The foundations were laid around 1360 by the Barnby family and the churchyard has wonderful views over the open moors and hills.

M1 J36. Take A61 to Sheffield. At roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit onto A616. Follow for 6 miles, turn left at Mortimer Road (to Bradfield). Turn right onto Chapel Lane, church on right.



## Monk Bretton Priory (7)

Children's quiz

Explore this wonderful ancient site, said to be one of the best preserved Cluniac sites, founded in 1153. The gatehouse is mainly 15<sup>th</sup> century, with carved faces. The outline of the church is clear. The kitchen rooms are late 13<sup>th</sup> century. Their stone drains may be the best remains of Cluniac drainage in Europe. The site is outdoors so there will be no volunteers if it rains.

M1 J37. Onto A628 into Barnsley. At roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit. At next roundabout take 2<sup>nd</sup> exit. Next roundabout, take 4<sup>th</sup> exit onto A61 (Old Mill Lane). Right at Burton Road and right into site.



## Penistone St John the Baptist (8)

Explore this beautiful church, mainly from the 13<sup>th</sup> century. There are many things to see, including the 15<sup>th</sup> century oak ceiling with finely carved roof bosses. Explore the sensory garden in the churchyard.

M1 J37. Follow A628 into Penistone. Left onto Bridge Street, church on left.



## Shepley St Paul (9)

This lovely Victorian church was built in 1848. Although of a simple design visitors tell us of the sense of peace they get and we feel proud that this is appreciated. We have a number of stained glass windows, most noticeably the east window which depicts scenes from the life of St Paul.

M1 J37. Follow A628 to Penistone. Just after passing Hoylandswaine turn right onto A629 Halifax Road. Follow into Shepley. Take 2<sup>nd</sup> left onto Marsh Lane, church on right. (SATNAV: HD8 8AE)



## Silkstone All Saints & St James the Greater (10)



**OPENING TIMES:** Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm  
Friday 10<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

**SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:** Guided tours & tower tours (children must have an adult)  
Heritage presentations & exhibitions  
Coal mining exhibition  
Light refreshments

A church has stood on this site since prior to 1066. Cathedral like in design with numerous bosses. The Bretton Chapel contains a huge marble memorial to Sir Thomas Wentworth and his wife Grace. The box pews date from 1862 and the church boasts a wonderful 14<sup>th</sup> century chancel screen. The outside boasts flying buttresses, the Huskar Pit Disaster Monument and 3 new gargoyles.

M1 J37. Follow A628 and signs to Silkstone. (SATNAV: S75 4JH)

Welcome to our lovely village church. There are many things to see including the tower and nave of the original 1627 church, a bell donated 1678 by Lady Mary Beaumont of Denby Hall, gallery, barrel roof, crossed rafter roof, pews, organ, chancel and memorial tablets. The family history registers date back to the mid 1800's and can be viewed by prior request.

M1 J37. Take the A628 on to Halifax Road A629 (signposted Manchester). Right on Falledge Lane B6115 to Upper Denby. Church is on left approaching Denby Lane. (SATNAV: HD8 8UN)



## Wombwell St Mary (13)

This charming village church is thought to be 12<sup>th</sup> century. Inside it contains the unique and fascinating double-decker tomb of Sir Roger Rockley, who died in 1534. It has magnificent carving on the 15<sup>th</sup> south door. Joseph Hunter wrote 'Few churches in South Yorkshire contain more to interest the curious enquirer'. Come and see for yourself!

M1 J36. Cross motorway turn left at onto A61 towards Barnsley. In Birdwell turn right onto Worsbrough Road and follow into Worsbrough village. (SATNAV: S70 5LQ)



## Wortley St Leonard (15)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 2pm

The present building dates from 1753. In the early 19<sup>th</sup> century the Earl of Wharnccliffe added a new tower, pulpit and a family vault. There are many things to see, including carved woodwork. The doors were made by Robert 'Mouseman' Thompson.

M1 J36. Take A61 towards Sheffield. At roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit onto A616. Take junction onto A629 to Wortley. Once in village church on left. (SATNAV: S35 7DR)



# DONCASTER

## Armthorpe St Leonard & St Mary (16)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

Explore this lovely church which is over 1000 years old in parts. There are some wonderful stained glass windows and a lovely Norman arch. The church is small in size but big in heart, and a warm welcome awaits all visitors.

M18 J4. Follow A630 to Doncaster. At 2<sup>nd</sup> roundabout turn left onto Hatfield Lane. At roundabout take 2<sup>nd</sup> exit onto Church Street. Church on left. (SATNAV: DN3 3AD)



## Barnburgh St Peter (17)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 1pm

**SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:** Coffee morning  
Concert (7pm)

This pretty country church was founded in 1150. It contains the famous Cresacre Chapel which contains the Cresacre Tomb with the 'Cat and Man' effigy - the centre of a remarkable legend. The church also has a fine collection of oak roof bosses, the remains of a Saxon or Norman cross and many hidden gems to discover.

A1(M) J36. Follow signs into Mexborough. At 2<sup>nd</sup> roundabout turn left. After houses take 2<sup>nd</sup> right. In Barnburgh turn left on Church Lane. (SATNAV: DN5 7ET)



## Barnby Dun St Peter & St Paul (18)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 10am - 4pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

This lovely village church largely dates from the 14<sup>th</sup> century, although the tower is 13<sup>th</sup> century. There are many interesting features to explore.

M18 J4. Follow A630. Right at 2<sup>nd</sup> roundabout onto A18. Take 1<sup>st</sup> left and follow signs. (SATNAV: DN3 1EB)



## Burghwallis St Helen (19)



**OPENING TIMES:** Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm  
Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September: 12pm - 4pm

**SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:** Display of church vestments & old church records  
Handbells on display & music playing  
Tea, coffee, cakes & scones

Come and visit our ancient church in a lovely secluded setting. See ancient herringbone masonry set within the walls. Inside there is much to see, including a 16<sup>th</sup> century brass and lovely stained glass windows - gifts of Revd Francis Peel (related to Robert Peel, founder of the police force).

A1(M) J38. Take A638 to Doncaster. Follow signs for Adwick, Skellow, Carcroft and Burghwallis. (SATNAV: DN6 9JL)

Situated in the centre of this lovely village. In the care of The Churches Conservation Trust.

A1(M) J36. A630 to Conisbrough. Right into Mill Lane, left into Nursery Lane and left into Cadeby Lane. (SATNAV: DN6 9JL)

'Wilcum'a' - A warm welcome to our ancient church. Parts are 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> century, the oldest part being the dog tooth moulding over the south door. One of the finest examples of the early work of Sir Ninian Comper who recreated the atmosphere of a medieval church with elaborate decoration and painting. See the results of 'Project Comper', our programme of restoration, and examples of early English & Medieval decoration and statuary.

M18 J3. Follow signs for Doncaster Dome. Pass Dome, at t-junction turn right onto A638 Bawtry Road. At lights turn left onto B1396 Cantley Lane and straight at roundabout. Right onto Church Lane. (SATNAV: DN4 6QR)

Welcome to the oldest building in South Yorkshire, parts of which date back to at least 750 AD and remain the core of the church today. Discover the many significant architectural and historical features, including the Romanesque tomb chest, two squints, the hagioscope and lychoscope, the pillared piscina, the perpendicular font dating back to 1400, the newly restored east window (originally by Hughes in 1866) and much more.

A1(M) J36. A630 into Conisbrough. Right at crossroads, follow road and turn left up Dale Road. Follow road to left, then turn right. Church on left. (SATNAV: DN12 3HR)

In the Isle of Axholme, with splendid views over the surrounding countryside. With origins in the 12<sup>th</sup> century, St Andrew's has features from the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 15<sup>th</sup> centuries. The church and the town have strong connections to the Wesley family; Reverend Samuel Wesley was rector from 1695 to 1735. After his ordination John was curate for a time to his father.

M18 J5 onto M180. At J2 take A161 to Gainsborough. In Epworth take 1<sup>st</sup> left onto High Street and bear left onto Church Street. Church is down a lane on the left. (SATNAV: DN9 1ES)

Explore this ancient village church, much admired for its size, openness and light. The church boasts 'the most lavishly decorated Norman doorway in Yorkshire' (Pevsner), which dates from 1170 - it is covered in rich carvings featuring people and animals. The rest dates from 1351. The area is lovely for walking and there is a good pub in the village.

M18 J4. Take A630. At roundabout turn right into Barnby Dun. Turn right onto Catling Lane/Stainforth Road. In Stainforth right at t-junction, then left, then right. Cross bridge and follow into Fishlake. (SATNAV: DN7 5JW)

This small Norman church has beautiful windows. The south door is a fine example of Norman stonework. The internationally famous craftsman Robert "Mouseman" Thompson of Kilburn, North Yorkshire, made most of the furniture, including the pulpit, the lectern, hymn boards, the main door and all pews. His trademark was a mouse and visitors can hunt for 27 carved mice.

M18 J6. A614 and take the 1<sup>st</sup> left. Follow through Stainforth then to Kirk Bramwith. (SATNAV: DN7 5SW)

Step back in time at one of the oldest churches in Doncaster, reputed to date back to Saxon times. Situated next to the canal and the River Don. The church contains the nationally famous and very rare Rokeby Chapel, built in 1521 and containing carved wooden screens and medieval stained glass. In the care of the Churches Conservation Trust.

Join local expert Pat McLaughlin for an in depth exploration of the history and heritage of this area, within the context of a national picture.

The course will explore how ancient beliefs contributed to the development of the major faiths. It will examine: standing stones, earthworks, burial mounds, Roman beliefs, the introduction of Christianity, the Saxon occupation of eastern England, return to paganism, the Viking effect, the Norman invasion, church and cathedral building, the renaissance, the Victorian gothic revival and modern architecture. To finish we will arrange a site visit to see the 'theory in practice'.

The courses are open to all, but places are limited so must be booked. Each course will be nine 2-hour sessions, one per week:

"The Invaders" - Romans, Saxons, Vikings, Normans
