BARNSLEY

Barnsley St Peter & St John the Baptist (1)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 2pm - 5pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 5pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Children's Craft Sessions (2.30pm - 4pm)
Refreshments

The church was designed by Temple Moore and completed in 1911. It was described by John Betjeman as 'Barnsley's hidden gem'. The high altar was designed by Robert 'Mousey' Thompson and is 'signed' with two mice! The church is well worth a visit. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J37: Follow A628 to Barnsley. Follow dual carriageway and at 3rd roundabout take the third exit (A61). Turn left into Taylor Row (A635) and follow round to right. Church on right. (SATNAV: S70 1JD).



Barnsley Quaker Meeting House (2)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 10am - 2pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

Friends' meeting house built in 1968 on the site of a previous Georgian meeting house. Burial ground around with traditional headstones - some dating back to the late 17th century, which were transferred from burial ground at Monk Bretton. Inside see old books on Quakerism, artefacts relating to the Quakers in Barnsley. The meeting house is accessible and has toilets.

M1 J37. Follow A628 into Barnsley town centre. At roundabout take 1st exit onto A635. Pass St Mary's church then take 2nd left onto Western Street. Meeting house on left. (SATNAV: S70 2BP)



Carlton St John the Evangelist (3)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10am - 2pm
Friday 11th: 10am - 2pm
Saturday 12th: 10am - 2pm
Sunday 13th: 10am - 4pm

Built in 1878 to a design by GE Street. Pevsner describes it as 'his grittiest church'. It is in the style of 13th century gothic with a Frisian tower. Inside there is a spectacular hanging Rood Cross painted by Romanian artist Christinel Păslaru and a newly restored Binns 3 Manual Organ. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J38. Turn left onto the A637. Cross the motorway and turn left onto B6131. At the t-junction turn right onto the A61 and then 2nd left onto Laiths Lane (B6132). Follow into Carlton, church on right. (SATNAV: S71 3EU)



Darfield All Saints (4)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 4.30pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

A wonderful church with parts dating to the 10th century. Many interesting details of historical significance - medieval tombstones, medieval painted ceiling, 15th century tomb, Jacobean pew and numerous Saxon carvings including a dragon. The church is accessible to wheelchairs.

M1 J37. At crossroads turn right. Follow road to Stairfoot roundabout. Take 2nd exit A635 towards Doncaster. Follow into Darfield. Turn right onto Nanny Marr Road, and immediate left onto School Street. Bear left onto Church Street, church on left. (SATNAV: S73 9JX)



Darfield All Saints Churchyard (4)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10.30pm - 3.30pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 4.30pm

Guided tours of the churchyard of the ancient church of Darfield. A beautiful place with lots of interesting graves including Lundhill Disaster Obelisk, Ebenezer Elliott (Corn Law Rhymer), Houghton Main Cage Disaster and Robert Millthorp (killed by his own gravestone).



Elsecar Holy Trinity (5)

OPENING TIMES: Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

Holy Trinity is a lovely church, consecrated in 1843. It is built in the gothic revival style that echoes back to early medieval times. The four stained glass chancel windows are a stunning example of William Morris & Co and were installed to commemorate parishioners killed during the First World War. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

M1 J36. At first roundabout take the 1st exit onto A61, at the 2nd roundabout take 3rd exit onto A6135. Turn left onto Hoyland Road and right onto Fearnley Road. Turn left at Wath Road, church on left.



Goldthorpe St John & St Mary (6)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments & Cakes!

Discover this unique concrete built Italianate church built in 1916. In a former mining village, but once inside you could easily be in Pisa! Beautifully proportioned and filled with interesting objects and innovative architectural and ecclesiastical features, including the High Altar and Lady Chapel, the church is well worth a visit. The church is accessible to wheelchairs.

A1(M) J37. Take A635 to Barnsley. After passing through Hickleton turn left onto Doncaster Road to Goldthorpe. In Goldthorpe turn right into Lockwood Road. Church on right. (SATNAV: S63 9JY)



Great Houghton St Michael & All Angels (7)

OPENING TIMES: Friday 11th: 9am - 2pm
Saturday 12th: 9am - 12pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

Explore one of three existing Cromwellian churches. Built in 1650, St Michael's has Jacobean box pews and was a family chapel of ease. It was visited by Cromwell within the first ten years of building. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J36. Follow A6195 Dearne Valley Pkway. At Cathill roundabout go straight. Next roundabout go straight into Great Houghton. Church Street on left.

Grimethorpe St Luke (8)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10.30am - 3pm
Friday 11th: 10am - 2pm
Saturday 12th: 10.30am - 2pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

St Luke's was built in 1904 'by the miners for the miners'. This large red brick building was a symbol not just of faith, but the very heart of Grimethorpe's mining heritage.

The church has a new altar in the Lady Chapel, made from the base of a boundary stone found in a local wood. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J36. Follow A6195 to Doncaster. Keep following A6195 until you see signs for Grimethorpe. Turn right into village, church on left. (SATNAV: S72 7JA)



Monk Bretton Priory (9)

OPENING TIMES: Sunday 13th: 10am - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Guided Tours
Children's Quiz
New Interpretative Panels (funded by HLF)

Explore this wonderful ancient site, said to be one of the best preserved Cluniac sites, founded in 1153. Today you can explore several buildings. The gatehouse is mainly 15th century, with carved faces. The remains of the church are clear. The kitchen rooms are late 13th century, with maybe the best remains of Cluniac drainage in Europe. The site is partially accessible to wheelchairs but will be closed if bad weather.

M1 J37. Onto A628 into Barnsley. At roundabout take 3rd exit. At next roundabout take 2nd exit. Next roundabout 4th exit onto A61 (Old Mill Lane). Right at Burton Road, right into site. (SATNAV: S71 5QD)



Penistone St John the Baptist (10)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10am - 4pm
Friday 11th: 10am - 4pm
Saturday 12th: 10am - 12pm & 2pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Guided Tours & Childrens Quiz
Refreshments

Explore this beautiful church dating mainly from the 13th century. There are many things to see, including the 15th century oak ceiling with finely carved roof bosses. Explore the sensory garden in the churchyard. The church is accessible to wheelchairs.

M1 J37. Follow A628 into Penistone. Left onto Bridge Street, church on left. (SATNAV: S36 6AR)



Silkstone All Saints & St James the Greater (11)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 12pm - 4pm
Friday 11th: 12pm - 4pm
Saturday 12th: 12pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Guided Tours & Tower Tours
Local History Displays
Refreshments

The 'Minster of the Moors' is worth discovery. A stately church, with 14th century screen, 15th century bosses, box pews and fine memorials - including one of the finest examples of a knight in armour. Outside are flying buttresses, pinnacles, new gargoyles and the Huskar Memorial. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J37. Follow A628 and signs to Silkstone. (SATNAV: S75 4JH)



Thurlstone St Saviour (12)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 1pm - 3pm
Friday 11th: 1pm - 3pm
Saturday 12th: 10am - 12pm & 2pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Childrens Activities
Craft Stalls
Refreshments

A beautiful parish church built at the beginning of the 20th century. It has excellent examples of carved woodwork (by local craftsmen) and a beautiful east window. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J37. Follow A628 to Manchester through Thurlstone village. Church set back on right. (SATNAV: S36 9QS)



Wombwell St Mary (13)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 2pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

There has been a place of worship on this site for over 800 years. However, the present church building has been developed in stages since 1896. It contains relics of the previous 12th church, stained glass and memorials. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J36. Take A61 then A6195 Dearne Valley Parkway. At 5th roundabout left into Wombwell. (SATNAV: S73 0DQ)



Worsbrough St Mary (14)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 9.30am - 12pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

This charming village church is thought to be 12th century. Inside it contains the unique and fascinating double-decker tomb of Sir Roger Rockley, who died in 1534. It has magnificent carving on the 15th south door. Joseph Hunter wrote 'Few churches in South Yorkshire contain more to interest the curious enquirer'. Come and see your yourself! The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M1 J36. Cross motorway turn left at onto A61 towards Barnsley. In Birdwell turn right onto Worsbrough Road and follow into Worsbrough village. (SATNAV: S70 5LQ)



Worsbrough St Thomas & St James (15)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

Discover this wonderful church, celebrating its 150th anniversary. The church has glorious Victorian stained glass windows, carved stone font and pulpit and many other interesting features. The church is set on the side of a hill, surrounded by a graveyard with a variety of trees. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

M1 J36. Cross motorway, left onto A61 to Barnsley. In Worsbrough right onto Bank End Road. (SATNAV: S70 4QQ)

DONCASTER

Armthorpe St Leonard & St Mary (16)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10am - 4pm
Friday 11th: 10am - 1pm
Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

Explore this lovely church which is over 1000 years old in parts. There are some wonderful stained glass windows and a lovely Norman arch. The church is small in size but big in heart, and a warm welcome awaits all visitors. The site is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

M18 J4. Follow A630 to Doncaster. At 2nd roundabout turn left onto Hatfield Lane. At roundabout take 2nd exit onto Church Street. Church on left. (SATNAV: DN3 3AD)



Austerfield St Helena (17)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 1pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

The present church was built in 1080. The Synod of Austerfield of 702 settled the manner in which Easter should be calculated. Inside there is a Sheela Na Gig - a quasi-erotic stone carving of a female figure. Austerfield is perhaps best known for its link with the Pilgrim Fathers. William Bradford, who became Governor of Plymouth, Massachusetts was baptised here in 1589. The church is partially accessible.

A1(M) J24. Take A614 Bawtry Road into Bawtry. After town centre turn right at fork, staying on A614. Follow into Austerfield, church on right. (SATNAV: DN10 6QU)



Barnburgh St Peter (18)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 5pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Parish Registers & Church Silver Exhibition
Local History Exhibition
Refreshments

This pretty country church was founded in 1150. It contains the famous Cresacre Chapel which contains the Cresacre Tomb with the 'Cat and Man' effigy - the centre of a remarkable legend. The church also has a fine collection of oak roof bosses, the remains of a Saxon or Norman cross and many hidden gems to discover. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

A1(M) J36. Follow signs into Mexborough. At 2nd roundabout turn left. After houses take 2nd right. In Barnburgh turn left on Church Lane. (SATNAV: DN5 7ET)



Lots of our heritage sites have got special activities for families and children.

Barnby Dun St Peter & St Paul (19)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 5pm
Sunday 13th: 10am - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Annual Festival of Art (over 300 pictures)
Craft Stalls
Tower Tours
Delicious Refreshments

This lovely village church largely dates from the 14th century, although the tower is 13th century. There are many interesting features to explore. The church is accessible to wheelchairs and has toilets.

M18 J4. Follow A630. Right at 2nd roundabout onto A18. Take 1st left and follow signs to Barnby Dun. (SATNAV: DN3 1EB)



Bawtry St Nicholas (20)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Light Refreshments

Built in the 12th century for the port of Bawtry, the church is dedicated to St Nicholas - the patron saint of sailors. The Norman doorway and east window (with its rare tracery) date from the 13th century. The font is 15th century and there is a 16th century painting of the flight of Joseph, Mary & Jesus to Egypt. The church is partially accessible.

A1(M) J24. Take A614 Bawtry Road into Bawtry. Turn right on Wharf Street. (SATNAV: DN10 6HX)



Burghwallis St Helen (21)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 12pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Light Refreshments & Cakes

Come and visit our ancient church in a lovely secluded setting. See ancient herringbone masonry set within the walls. Inside there is much to see, including a brass from 1554 and lovely stained glass windows - gifts of Revd Francis Peel (related to Robert Peel, founder of the police force). The church is partially accessible and has toilets.

A1(M) J38. Take A638 to Doncaster. Follow signs for Adwick, Skellow, Carcroft and Burghwallis. (SATNAV: DN6 9JL)



Cadeby St John the Evangelist (22)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 2pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 4pm

An exquisite example of the work of Victorian architect George Gilbert Scott. The carving is particularly fine. Situated in the centre of this lovely village. In the care of The Churches Conservation Trust. The building is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

A1(M) J36. A630 to Conisbrough. Right into Mill Lane, left into Nursery Lane and left into Cadeby Lane. (SATNAV: DN6 9JL)

Cantley St Wilfrid (23)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10pm - 5pm
Friday 11st: 10pm - 5pm

A warm welcome awaits you at this lovely ancient church. Parts of the building are 11th, 12th and 14th century. The church was restored in 1894 by Sir Ninian Comper and is one of the finest examples of his early work. He recreated the atmosphere of a medieval parish church complete with elaborate decoration and painting. Visitors will have the opportunity to see the Rood Screen in course of restoration. During restoration work, the Chancel is only accessible via steps.

M18 J3. Follow signs for Doncaster Dome. Pass Dome, at t-junction turn right onto A638 Bawtry Road. At lights turn left onto B1396 Cantley Lane and straight at roundabout. Right onto Church Lane. (SATNAV: DN4 6QR)



Conisbrough St Peter (24)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 11am - 3pm
Friday 11th: 11am - 3pm
Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 1pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Treasure Trail for Children & Display of Ancient Silver Refreshments (Saturday & Sunday)

Step back in time in this ancient and fascinating church. The oldest building in South Yorkshire, the church dates back to 740/750AD. Many significant architectural and historical features to discover Romanesque tomb chest, hagioscope, lychoscope, pillared piscina. The church is accessible.

A1(M) J36. A630 into Conisbrough. Right at crossroads, follow road and turn left up Dale Road. Follow road to left, then turn right. Church on left. (SATNAV: DN12 3HR)



Doncaster St Andrew Methodist Church (25)

OPENING TIMES: Friday 11th: 2pm - 4pm
Saturday 12th: 10.30am - 12.30pm & 2pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 2pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Photographic Display & Refreshments
Local Walk (Friday 2.30pm & Saturday 11am)

A 'child of its time' built in 1916, the church reflects the growth of Doncaster bringing together the local social and religious history of this and two other Methodist churches in the Wheatley area.

A1(M) J37. Follow A635 to town centre. Cross bridge, take 2nd exit at 1st and 2nd roundabouts. (SATNAV: DN2 4TS)



Doncaster St George (Minster) (26)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 10.30am - 3.30pm
Friday 11th: 10.30am - 3.30pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Embroidery & Photographic Displays

A fine example of Victorian Gothic architecture designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott in 1853. Housing an organ by the famous German maker Edmund Schulze.

A1(M) J36. Follow A630 to Doncaster town centre. Follow signs to Minster. (SATNAV: DN1 1RD)



Finningley Holy Trinity & St Oswald (27)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

A delightful medieval church surrounded by an award winning churchyard. The church is mainly 11th century, the south door is possibly Saxon. See the Norman tub font, 1608 charity board, WW1 window and an interesting roof with 23 bosses. The church is partially accessible.

M18 J5. Join M180 and leave at J1. Follow A18 Tudworth Road to Bawtry. Turn left onto A614 Stone Hill into Finningley. Turn right onto The Green and slight right into Rectory Lane. Church at end. (SATNAV: DN9 3DA)



Fishlake St Cuthbert (28)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Scarecrow Festival & Refreshments

Explore this ancient village church, much admired for its size, openness and light. The church boasts 'the most lavishly decorated Norman doorway in Yorkshire' (Pevsner), which dates from 1170. It is covered in rich carvings featuring people and animals. The rest dates from 1351. The area is lovely for walking and there are good pubs in the village. The church is accessible.

M18 J4. Take A630. At roundabout turn right into Barnby Dun. Turn right onto Catling Lane/Stainforth Road. In Stainforth right at t-junction, then left, then right. Cross bridge and follow into Fishlake. (SATNAV: DN7 5JW)



Hickleton St Wilfred (29)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

A stunning medieval church demonstrating many beautiful features from this period. Inside the church is full of interesting paintings. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

A1(M) J37. Take A635 then 1st left. Follow through Marr into Hickleton. Church at crossroads. (SATNAV: DN5 7BH)



High Melton St James (30)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 1pm - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 1pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

A charming village church filled with memorials to the Fountayne family and others. Originally built in 1153, it has been extensively extended. Spectacular Comper rood screen and reredos. Full of beautiful mediaeval and Victorian stained glass windows. The church is partially accessible.

A1(M) J37. Take A635 Barnsley. Turn left in Marr and again into High Melton. Church on right. (SATNAV: DN5 7TB)



Kirk Bramwith St Mary (31)

OPENING TIMES: Saturday 12th: 10am - 4pm
Sunday 13th: 12pm - 4pm

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Refreshments

This small Norman church has beautiful windows. The south door is a fine example of Norman stonework. The church was furnished by the famous craftsman Robert Thompson of Kilburn. His trademark was a mouse and visitors are invited to search for all 27 carved mice in the church. The church is partially accessible to wheelchairs.

M18 J6. A614 and take the 1st left. Follow through Stainforth then to Kirk Bramwith. (SATNAV: DN7 5SW)



Kirk Sandall St Oswald (32)

Early Norman church situated next to the canal and the River Don. The church contains the nationally famous and very rare Rokeby Chapel, built in 1521 and containing carved wooden screens and medieval stained glass. In the care of The Churches Conservation Trust. The church is partially accessible.

M18 J4. Follow A630. Turn right at 2nd roundabout, then straight across. Turn left onto Brecks Lane and follow. Straight across Doncaster Road onto Sandall Lane, take 3rd right. (SATNAV: DN3 1RA)



Loversall St Katherine (33)

OPENING TIMES: Thursday 10th: 1.30pm - 3.30pm
Friday 11th: 1.30pm - 3.30pm

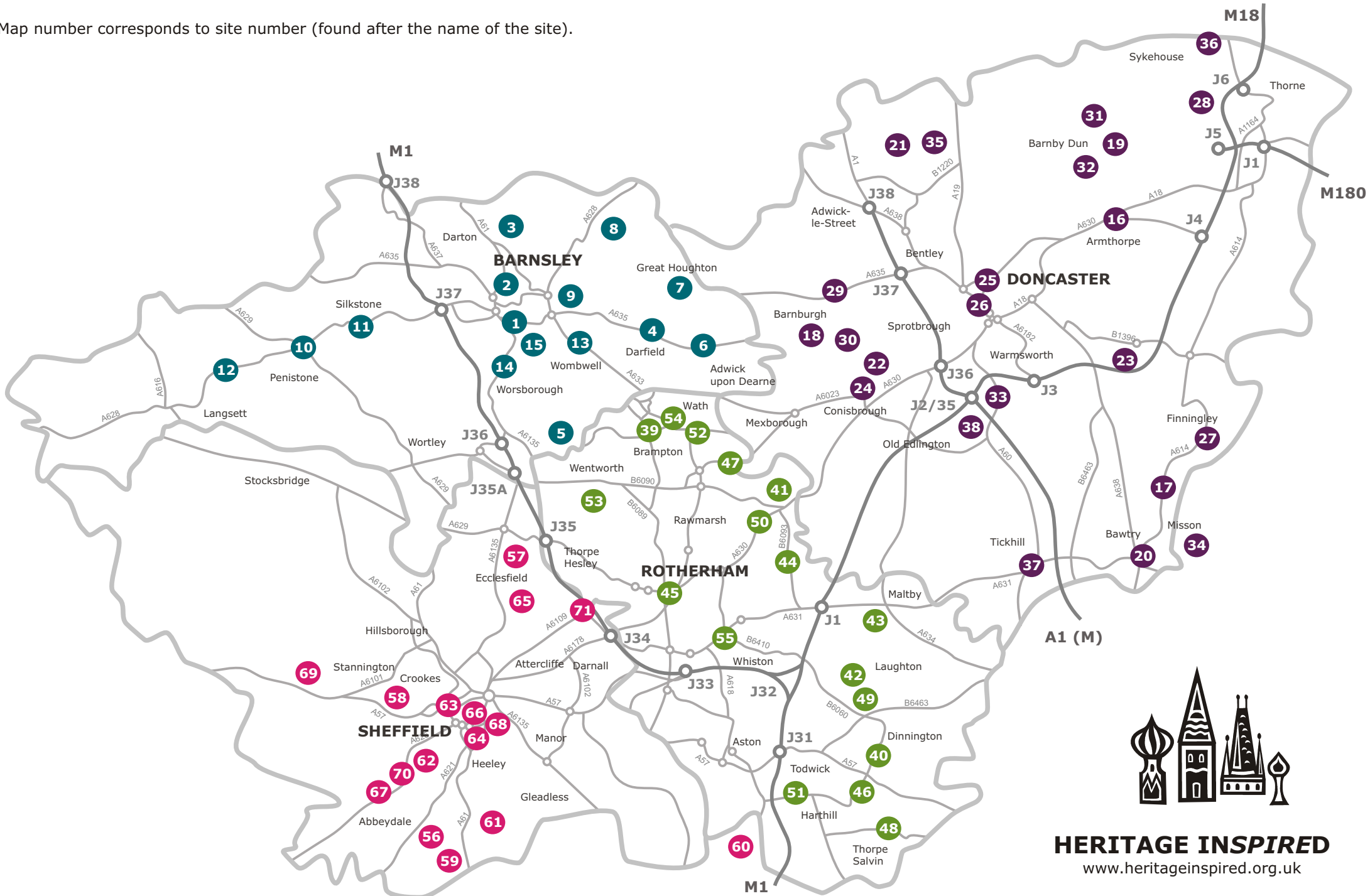

The oldest building in the area and the remaining link to Wincobank Hall, this lovely chapel is a short walk from the Ironage Hillfort. Established by two ladies who were campaigners for the Abolition of Slavery, their visitors included William Wilberforce. The chapel dates from 1841. The chapel is accessible to wheelchairs.

M1 J34. Follow A6109 to Sheffield, after ½ mile turn right at Jenkin Road. Continue to the top and over the brow of the hill. Fork left onto Wincobank Avenue. The chapel is 50 yards on left. (SATNAV: S5 6BB)

Want to know more? Why not follow up your visits with a fascinating local heritage course!

Join local expert Pat McLaughlin for an in depth exploration of the history and heritage of this area, within the context of a national picture.

The course will explore how ancient beliefs contributed to the development of the major faiths. It will examine: standing stones, earthworks, burial mounds, Roman beliefs, the introduction of Christianity, the Saxon occupation of eastern England, return to paganism, the Viking effect, the Norman invasion, church and cathedral building, the renaissance, the Victorian gothic revival and modern architecture.
